SUBJECT: Petit Lake Dam (aka Big Canoe) Pickens County

Dear Mr. Bates:

It was a pleasure meeting you on February 16, 2009 for the FY09 annual inspection of the subject dam. I apologize for the delay in following up with you. During the inspection, we noted the following:

- 1. The dam is being well maintained and had been mowed. There were some small pine trees and overhanging branches along the right (as facing downstream) abutment of the downstream slope. It would be advisable to cut this vegetation back.
- 2. There were several holes in the floor of the concrete chute spillway. There was exposed rebar in some of the holes.
- 3. The area around the drains at the downstream toe of the dam had been cleared. We were informed that the drains had been camera inspected and that some are surface drains. There was water flowing underneath at least one of the drains, and several of the drains remain in a deteriorated condition.

Our office has received a report for repairing wave action erosion along the shoreline of the dam. This report has not been reviewed yet. In addition, several years ago there was concern over the stability of the dam, specifically during a seismic event. An evaluation was performed and an engineering report was submitted to our office. However, this issue was never resolved. In addition, the areas that have deteriorated in the concrete chute spillway (mentioned in Item #2 above) need to be addressed.

It is my understanding that Tom Woosley, P.E., manager of our Permitting and Compliance Unit, will be meeting with representatives of the Big Canoe POA at the dam in July to discuss the engineering reports that have been submitted and any other issues with the dam, including the holes in the spillway (see enclosed e-mail). After that meeting, deadlines will likely be given for resolving any concerns.
